That is why we need this General Election to clear the air and settle whether the country wants Theresa May or Jeremy Corbyn to lead these discussions.

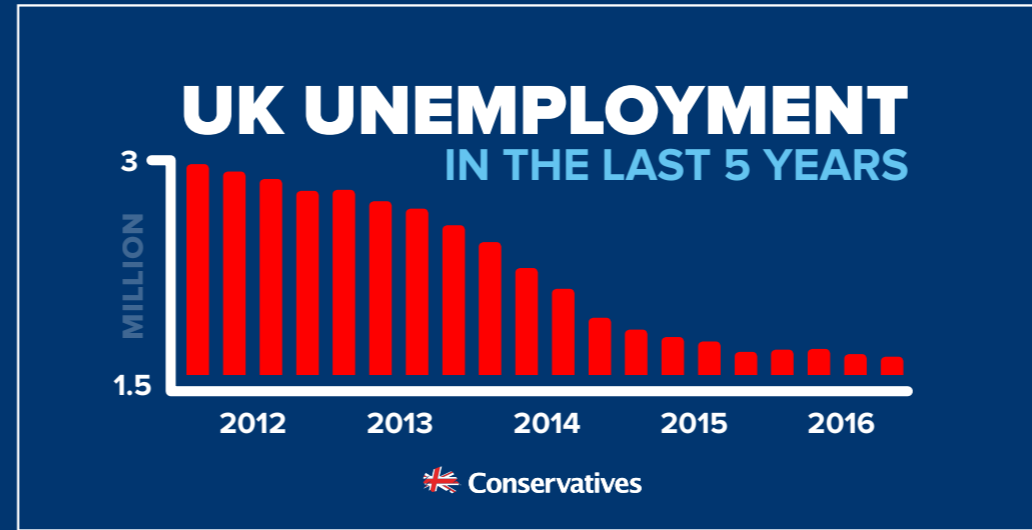

Unemployment is at its lowest level for many years. In Camborne and Redruth, the number of claimants has nearly halved from 3.8% of the economically active population in 2010 to 2.3% in November 2016. George wants to ensure that we create better paid jobs for this part of Cornwall. He wants to see new companies

become successful and profitable enough to offer higher wages that encourage people to take work and stay in work. George welcomed the introduction of the national living wage, and is in discussions about how we can take forward the idea of a Fibre Park in Pool.

### Dear Resident

The coming months represent a fresh start for our politics and that is why in this election we need to choose a strong Prime Minister in Theresa May. Nothing should stand in the way of the democratic decision voters took last year.

I have been an MP for this area for seven years. My family have lived and worked in the Camborne, Redruth and Hayle area for over four hundred years, first working in the mining and engineering industry and then farming at Gwinear, where they have lived for the past 150 years.

Since my election in 2010, I have championed economic regeneration in Cornwall. I was a member of the Environment and Rural Affairs Select Committee and concentrated on a variety of issues including water poverty in rural areas and dangerous dog legislation. Since 2013, I have been a Minister at the Department for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs, with responsibility for agriculture, fisheries and food. My other work in Parliament has included presenting a Private Members Bill giving new protection to borrowers who offer lenders a security interest over their assets. I successfully campaigned to protect Cornwall's policing budget and extend the £50 rebate on water bills in the South West.

Locally, we are seeing change take shape. Work continues at the Kresen Kernow archive centre in Redruth, which is set to open in 2018. We have seen huge progress at Hayle, and I am delighted that the marine energy park on North Quay is now starting to attract new enterprise and industry to the area. The next stage is to complete sensitive development at the end of South Quay, put in place the footbridge to link the quay to Penpol Terrace and get things moving on North Quay.

Finally, now that we have the new link road, it is time to progress the regeneration of Tuckingmill. I have recently been having discussions with the various landowners around the site of South Crofty mine and hope we can start to see plans progress in the coming months.

I am proud to have represented my home towns over the last seven years, and I am asking for you to lend me your support again in this election.

## SUPPORTING NEW INDUSTRY AND HIGHER PAID JOBS

Wave Hub continues to go from strength to strength. Carnegie Wave Energy, a leading wave energy developer from Australia, has been awarded a grant to support the first phase of its £60M commercial wave energy project at Wave Hub. American wave energy developer, GWave, has announced its plans for a 9MW wave energy project to be deployed at Wave Hub.

George has been engaging with ministers and arguing for a change in the energy pricing regime, to help companies such as Carnegie and GWave. This will make sure that sectors such as offshore wind are not at an advantage over wave energy. ■

# THE NEW "TINNER" BUS SERVICE

### MARKS A MAJOR STEP FORWARD IN THE QUALITY OF PUBLIC TRANSPORT IN CORNWALL.

George has pressed for a regular 30 minute local train service through Cornwall with buses then providing onward connections over shorter rural routes to our villages.

He has also been fighting to get an upgrade to the "Night Riviera" sleeper service, which will be introduced shortly. George said, "Just because we are a long way from London shouldn't mean we have to put up with second best when it comes to transport.

Great progress has been made upgrading road, rail and bus links in the last five years but there is more to do." ■



## MAKING SURE THE NEXT GENERATION GETS A GREAT START IN LIFE

George is committed to ensuring fair funding for Cornwall. He recently met with the Department for Education to discuss the early years funding formula.

He has welcomed the news that the Government has provided assurances that it will provide supplementary funding of £55 million a year to local authorities for maintained nursery schools, in order to keep their funding stable during the implementation of the formula. There will be a consultation regarding the longer term. There will be a minimum funding rate of at least £4.30 per hour, and the



Government will also be introducing a new national Disability Access Fund to support access for disabled children.

George has made creating opportunities for the next generation a priority. He supports the National Citizenship Service scheme, which is open to all 16-17 year olds in England. It gives participants the chance to immerse themselves in a fresh environment, make new friends and develop confidence and independence. ■

## PROTECTING OUR GREEN SPACES

George is clear that there should be a principle of building on brownfield sites before greenfield sites, especially around our towns. He asked the Secretary of State to consider calling in a planning appeal for over 220 houses on St George's Road in Hayle. The scheme was blocked. ■
